Attachment 2 to your Recember 2m, 1867 tetter proposes a reduction in watchstanding requirements of IC EFP 55.31(a) and (f). The specific details on the reduction in watchstanding were included in a separate letter to the RFC also dated Recember 2B, 1987 (letter 4410-87.1-0187/0279F). The staff will evaluate the request for a reduction in the watchstanding requirements in its future residence to that letter. Therefore, an exemption to the watchstanding requirements (10 EFP 55.53(e)) for IMI-2 is not granted at this time.

As discussed in Enclosure 2 to this letter, the TMI-2 Licensed Operator Requalification Program, Rev. 3, is acceptable, and exemptions are granted to 10 GFR 55.59[c](2) subsections (iv) and (v) and 10 GFR 55.59(c)(3)(1) items (A) through (AA).

The execution has been forwarded to the Office of the Federal Register for publication.

EXEMPTION

1.

GPU Nuclear Corporation, Metropolitan Edison Company, Jersey Central Power and Light Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company (collectively, the licensee) are the holders of Facility Operating License No. DPP-73, which had authorized operation of the Three Mile Island Nuclear Station, Unit 2 (TMI-2) at power levels up to 2777 regawatts thermal. The facility, which is located in Londonderry Township, Gauphin County, Pennsylvania, is a pressurized water reactor previously used for the commercial generation of electricity.

By Order for Modification of License, dated July 20, 1979, the licensee's authority to operate the facility was suspended and the licensee's authority was limited to maintenance of the facility in the present shutdown cooling mode (44 FR 45271). Py further Order of the Director, Office of Buclear Reactor Regulation, dated February 11, 1980, a new set of formal license requirements was imposed to reflect the post-accident condition of the facility and to assure the continued maintenance of the turnent safe, stable, long-term cooling condition of the facility (45 FR 11292). The license provides, among other things, that it is subject to all rules, regulations and Orders of the Commission now or hereafter in effect.

By letter dated Becerber 28, 1987, which discussed Perision 3 of the TRI-2 Licensed Operator Requalification Program, the licensee requested exemptions from requirements of 10 CFF 55.59, "Requalification." Specifically, the licensee requested exemption from the requirements of 10 CFF 55.59(c)(2), Lectures, subjects (iv) and (v). Subsection (2) to 10 CFF 55.59(c) requires that the operator requalification program contain preplanned lectures or a regular and continuing tasks throughout the license period in areas where explains in scope and depth of coverage is needed. After topics are listed in the regulations. The licensee has requested exemption from topics (iv) Flort protection systems and (v) Engineered safety systems.

The licensee has also requested everytion from 55.59(c)(3), Ce-the-Job Training, subsection (4), tiers (A) through (AA). The regulations require under 55.59(c)(3) that the requalification program include on-the-Job training so that each licensed operator varifulates the plant controls and each licensed senior operator either vanipulates the controls or directs the activities of individuals during plant control varifulations. The varifulation must consist of a set of specified vanipulations corresponding to various plant evolutions applicable to the plant design. Section 10 CFR 55.59(c)(3)(4)(A) through (AA) specifies the various plant evolutions for which all operators will be required to earifulate the facility controls arrubilly or in some cases biannually during the term of the licensed operator's or senior operator's

Titense. They can be performed at the plant or on a simulator. The manipulations required include plant startup, plant shutdown, panual control of feedmater, loss of coolant events, turbine trip, reactor trip, and loss of electric power.

III.

TMI-2 is currently in a post-accident, cold shutdown, long-term oftenue mode, with sufficient decay heat recoval assured by direct heat loss from the reartor coolant system to the reactor building atmosphere. The licensee is presently engaged in defunding the damaged reactor, decontaminating the facility and readying the plant for long-term storage. The requirements to maintain safety related systems have been detected from the TMI-2 corating license. The present unconventional configuration of the TMI-2 plant does not allow the conventional evolutions remain to an operating facility.

The licensee has requested exemption from the requirement to include preplanned lectures in the requaliffication evogram throughout the individual's license period on Plant Protection Systems and Engineering Safety Systems.

The Featter Protection and the Engineering Safety Features Actuation.

System constitute the Plant Protection Systems at Tmi-2. Both of these systems have been disabled. The Feattor Protection System is currently used only for plant monitoring. The monitoring capability of the portions of the system that are still functioning are addressed in the "Flant Instrumentation and Control Systems" lecture.

There currently is no requirement in the TM1-2 license to maintain the the Engineered Safety Features Actuation System and no training on this system is included in the requalification program.

The licensee has also requested that they be exempted from control manipulations required by 10 CFR 55.59(c)(3)(1), subsections (A) through (AA). In lieu of the requirements to perform the specific manipulations required by the regulations, the licensee has included in the TMI-2 Licensee Cherator Regulatification Training Program abnormal and energency evolutions that are applicable to TMI-2 in its current condition. These evolutions provide a more meaningful requalification training program for the TMI-2 licensed operators. The licensee believes that the current requalification program, which specifies completion of specific evolutions through the plant criff program, satisfies the intent of the regulation.

Verification by an NPC subject varies expert has confirmed that exemptions to the requirements of 10 CFR 55.59(c)(2) and 10 CFR 55.59(c)(3)(1) are appropriate and relevant to the present condition of TMI-2.

IY.

Accordingly, the commission has determined that pursuant to 10 CFP 55.11. these exemptions are authorized by law, will not endanger life or property property and are otherwise in the public interest.

Accordingly, the Commission hereby grants execution from the requirements of 10 CFF 55.59(c)(2), subsections (1v) and (1v), and 10 CFF Pert 55.59(c)(3)(1) times (A) through (AA).

Pursuant to 10 CFP 51.32, the Commission has determined that granting of this execution will have no significant depact on the environment (\$3 FP 33552). This execution is effective as of the date of issuance.

SAFETY EVALUATION OF REVISION 3, THI-2 LICENSED OPERATOR REQUALIFICATION PROBLEM

BACKEROUND

By letter dated becomer 28, 1987, GPU Nuclear Corporation requested a review of Revision 3 of the TM1-2 Licensed Operator Requalification Program. Since there is a reduction in scope of the program, this review is required in accountance with 10 CFR 50.54 (1-1). The staff's review of the revisions to the program follows.

Lectures

In requesting an exemption from the lecture requirements of TO CFR 55.59 (c)(2), the licensee states:

10 CFR 55.59(c)[2], "Requalification Program Requirements." subsections (iv) and (v) respectively require lecture topics for "Plant Protection Systems" and "Engineered Safety Systems" as part of the licensed operator requalification program.

In lieu of this requirement, the monitoring capabilities of the TMI-2 installed systems are addressed under "Plant Instrumentation and Control Systems" in Attachment 1 to the Licensed Operator Requalification Training Program. The Reactor Protection Systems at TMI-2 have been disabled and are used for plant monitoring.

The "Engineered Safe: Systems" at TMI-2 have also been disabled and training on these systems is not included in this orogram. This exception was previously contained in Revision 2 to the TMI-2 Licented Ocerator Requalification Training Program (neference GPU No. letter 4410-88-L-0138 dated September 15, 1984).

This exception was approved in Revision 2 to the er er and is acceptable as part of Revision 3 as it is consistent with the current condition of the plant.

On the Job Training

The licensee has requested exceptions to the control manipulations required by 10 CFR 55.59(c)(3)(i), subsections (A) to (AA) as follows:

In lieu of the above requirement, Attachment 2 to the TRI-2 Libensed Operator Requalification Training Program Identifies the abhormal and emergency evolutions that are applicable to TRI-2. These evolutions provide a more meaningful requalification training program for the TRI-2 licensed operators. Additionally, the requalification program specifies completion of the evolutions through the plant drill program. GPU Ruclear believes this to be acceptable per 10 CFR 55.59 [c][4][iv]. "Evaluation," which states: "The requalification program must include...(iv) simulation of emergency or abnormal conditions that may be accomplished by using the control panel of the facility is used for simulation, the action teken or to be taken for the emergency or abnormal conditions shall be discussed; actual manipulation of the plant controls is not required."

Verification by a Subject matter expert has confirmed that these exceptions are appropriate and relevant to the present condition of TMI-Z. They are, therefore, acceptable.

Program Hours of Instruction

Revision 2 of licensee's operator requalification training grogram required approximately 200 hours of instruction per year. The proposed revision (Revision 31 does not specify a minimum time requirement. The time scheduled will be appropriate to the time needed to accomplish the program requirements, which licensee indicates is a performance-based approach consistent with the current condition of TMI-2. Since the licensee's approach does appear to be performance based and 10 CFR 55.59 does not specify any minimum time requirement for the training program, this change to the program is acceptable.

Reactivity Manipulations

Revision 2 of the requalification training program requires that each licensee perform a variety of reactivity manipulations, including:

- . Observation of subcritical multiplication.
- * Observation of reactivity feedback from nuclear heat during startup.
- Demonstration of the effects of fuel displacement in subcritical multiplication and observed effects on nuclear instrumentation.

Licensee proposes to delete the requirement to perform these three mentionalisions and has stated:

Experience gained through defueling operations has demonstrated that fuel movements have no observable effect on subcritical multiplication or nuclear instrumentation. Classroom lectures on the theory and principles of subcritical reactors are considered to be adequate training coverage of these topics.

Verification by subject matter expert confirms that performing the above reactivity manipulations is no longer necessary due to the current condition of the TMI-Z reactor. This reduction in scope is, therefore, acceptable.

Research Reactor Training Time

Revision 2 of the licensee's requalification program required 20 hours per year of research reactor or bests principles training simulator training. The purpose of this requirement was to perform the reactivity manipulations mentioned above. Since these manipulations no longer need to be performed, the

need for this simulator training is obviated. The deletion of this requirement in Revision 3 is, therefore, acceptable.

Written Examination

Revision 2 of the requalification program required administration of an annual written requalification examination. In Revision 3, the period for administration of this examination has been increased to blenniat. This change is consistent with 10 CFR 55.59(a)(1) and is, therefore, acceptable.

Fuel Handling Senior Reactor Operator (FHSRO) Training Program

Licensee's submittel indicates that the FMSRO training program has been deleted because the initial training for this specific position has been completed. In addition, the requalification training for the FMSRO position has been incorporated into the TMI-2 licensed operator requalification training program. This reduction in scope is acceptable since the status of TMI-2 precludes the need for future initial training for the FMSRO position.

The licensee also states that the required reactivity manipulations included in the initial training program are not contained in the requalification program. The purpose of these manipulations was to maintain familiarity with plant systems, controls, and procedures. The licensee has determined that those individuals holding the FMSRD license perform these evolutions on a frequent busis and have done so throughout the TMI-Z defueling experience. In that this is a performance-based approach to skill acquisition and maintenance, the staff finds it acceptable.

Licensee has also reduced the frequency of administration of the written examination from annual to biennial. This change is consistent with 10 CFR \$5.59 (a)(1).

Watchstanding

In its submittal dated December 28, 1967, the licensee proposes a reduction in the watchstanding requirements of 10 CFR 55.31 (e) and (f). However, the licensee stated that the actual details of the request for such exemption would be submitted under separate cover. The staff will therefore evaluate the ments of that request by separate memorandum.
